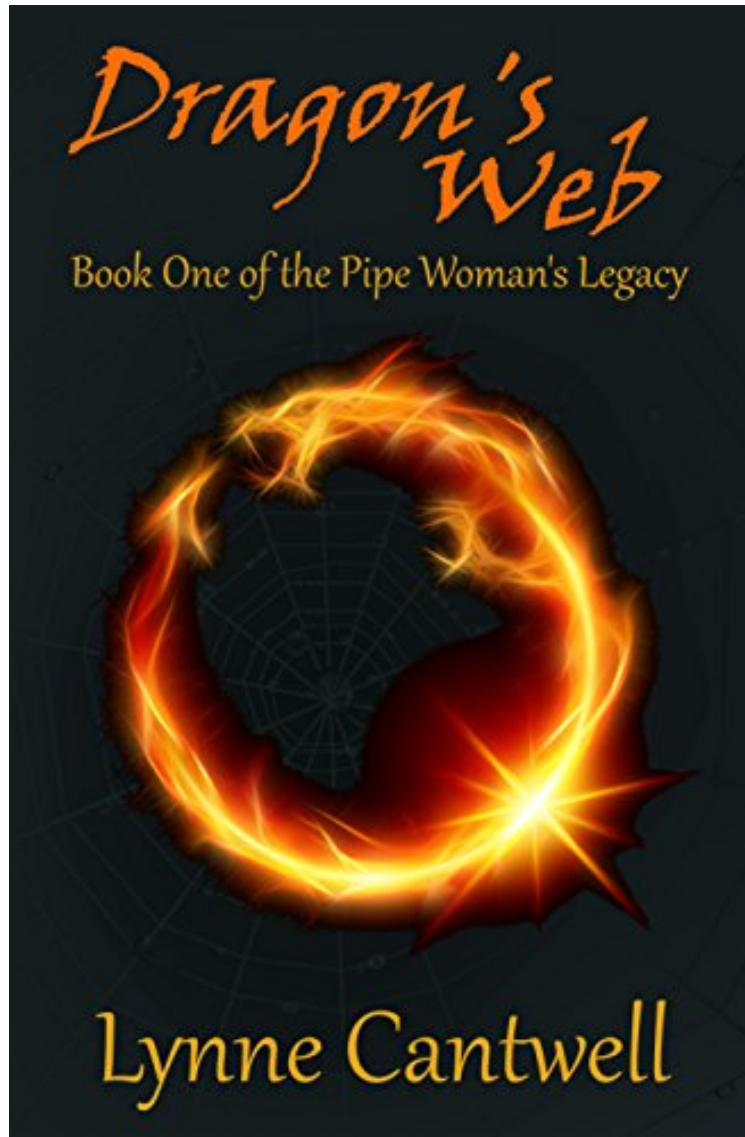

didn't see this story coming though I am pleased the author has decided to continue on from where she left off with her previous series, *The Pipe Woman Chronicles*. Here we re-visit White Buffalo Calf Pipe Woman and her husband, Coyote, or to keep things simple, Naomi and Joseph. Right away, we catch up with the family and their two grown children, Webb and Sage who seem to have inherited some of their parents special powers and smarts. This new book has an easy introduction that sets you up for what turns out to be a very intriguing story. You can just dive into this tale without having read any of the other books. There is substance to the plot line in similar ways that we worry about global warming. This pays attention to our environment, climate changes, disintegrating water supplies and the costly changes that are occurring. I love the authors comfortable way of telling her stories and how her characters are convincingly real. Flawed and human. It's their quirks that I found so compelling. Another thing I do adore are the different points of view. It was fun not just being in Sage's head but Webb's as well. Made for a pleasing, well-rounded paranormal coming-of-age adventure that had me in anticipation all the way through. Quote ~"But I'm not 'every teenager,' am I?" I cried. "I'll never be normal.
