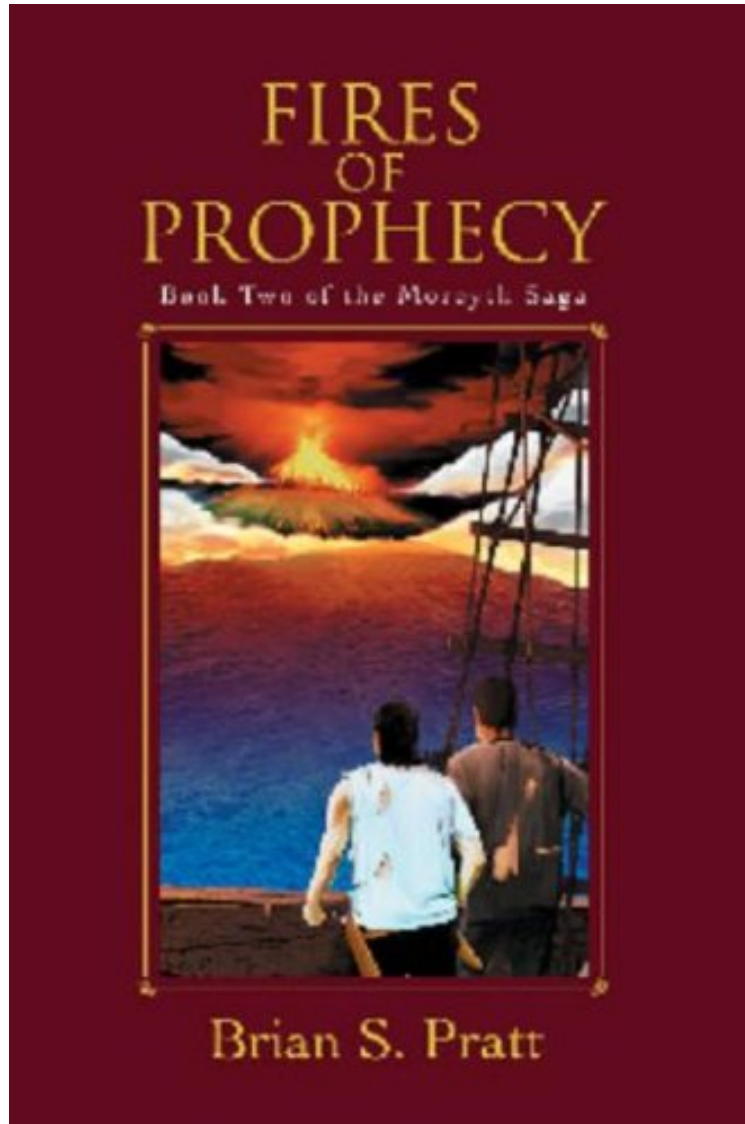

Buch der Saga Elemente aus Rollenspielen aufgreift, dann dieses Buch erst recht. Im Laufe des Geschehens bildet sich eine richtige Party, die durchaus in Rollenspielen wie Neverwinter Nights, oder Baldursgate vorkommen könnte.
