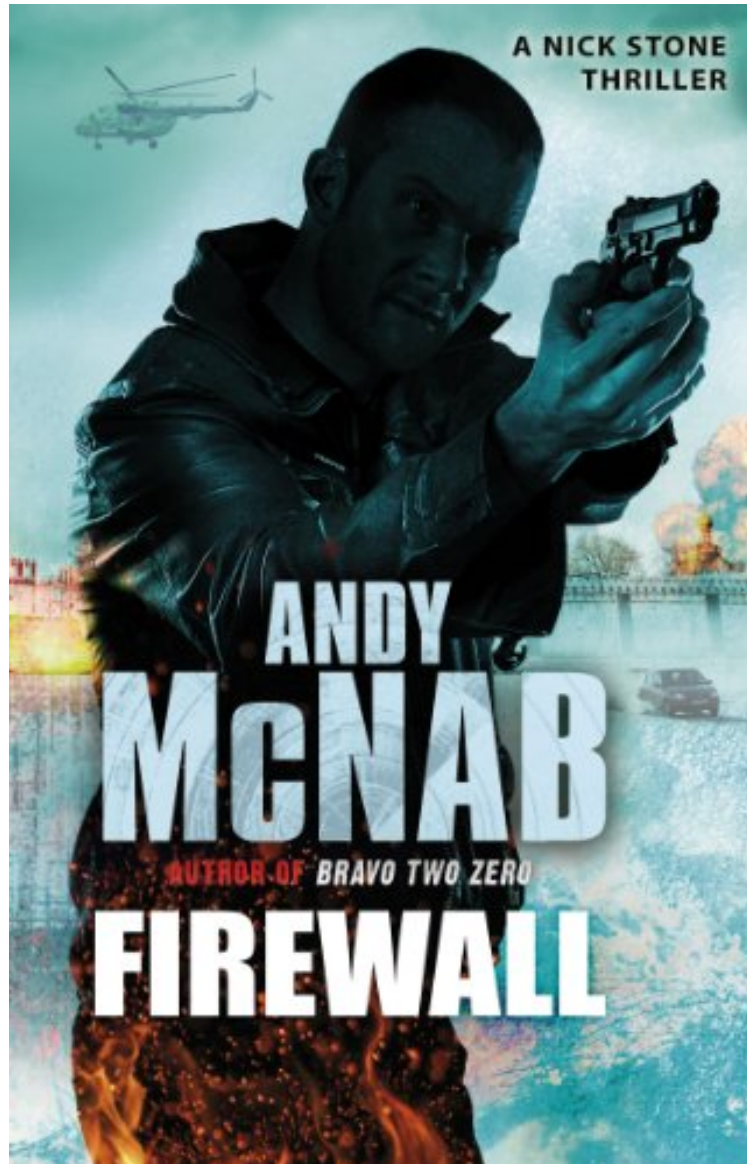

Keeping in mind McNab's background, the whole story -

though sounding a bit far-fetched at first - gains in authenticity as you progress. Attention to detail, imaginative characters and a sense of humour make this an enjoyable read, despite the somewhat bleak setting. You might want to start with McNab's first novel though, as the character of Nick Stone evolves from book to book.
