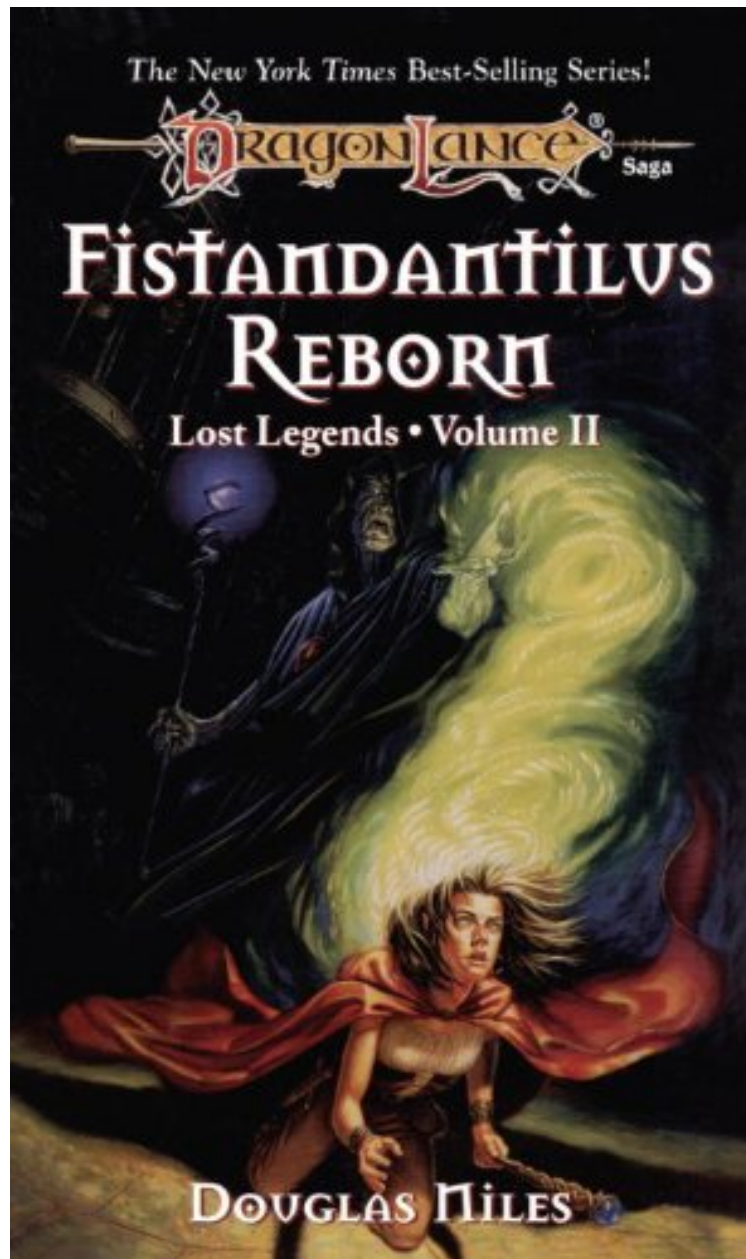

Von markley@erols.com After reading some of his sad attempts in the Forgotten Realms setting, I'm usually hesitant when it comes to buying novels by Doug Niles, but this was refreshingly different. It was well written, giving a great description of Krynn's landscape; had, for the most part, interesting characters; and, best of all, an excellent plot! There are spots where one might find himself confused time-wise, seeing as how you're told what year each chapter takes place, and how sometimes the years seem to go backwards, but after a lot of study and re-reading, I have come to the conclusion that no mistakes were made (time-wise). The only real mistake that I can remember (it's been a while since I read this) was in the chapter in which Fistantantilus's apprentice is running from the Tower and hears what sounds like a magical battle taking place. Problem? The battle between Fistantantilus and Raistlin didn't take place in the Tower of High Sorcery, but in Fistantantilus's castle (the location of which I am not entirely sure, but which can be seen in "War of the Twins," in the chapter in which Raistlin is forced to remember the battle). Anyway, all that to say it's a great book, don't let the retarded, has-nothing-to-do-with-the-book cover scare you away, and kudos to Doug for finally writing a half-decent book!

For starters, the book's setup is intriguing, with jaunts back and forth in time as Foryth Teel, who, up until the end, was the omnipotent narrator uncovers more information about the mysterious Fistantantilus and his dual-lives. Secopd, the book explained a great many things about Fist, whose whereabouts up until this book were a complete mystery. As well, it reveals the origins of Foryth Teel (whom Niles has used in past short stories about little-known historical events) and how a kender got to Forgotten Realms... heh. My only gripe: it didn't give us the part about the Heroes of the Lance's jaunt through Skullcap, an event no ever novelized. In all, the book is engaging and very well-executed. It makes me think that perhaps Niles gave it his all here and that was why The Last Thane was awful.
