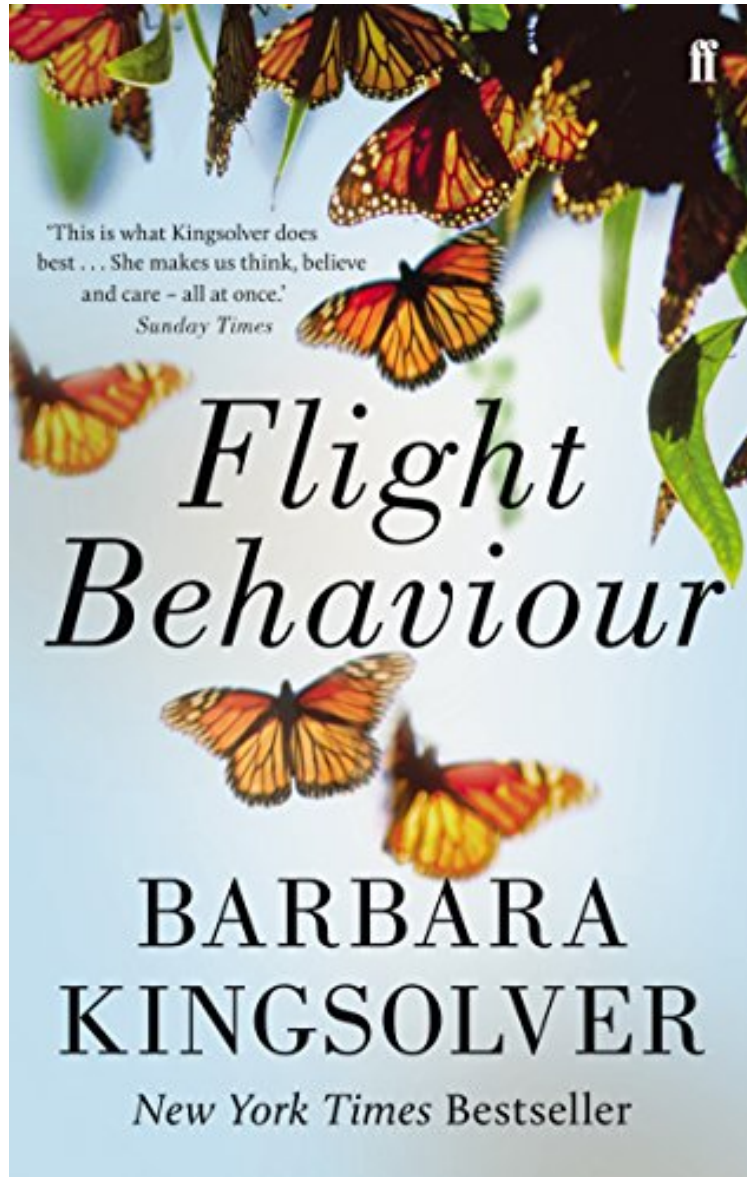

DisappointedVon chrispyEven though I'm a real Kingsolver-fan I'm afraid I cannot give this book more than two stars.Of course the underlying idea of environmental changes ... with devastating impact on the monarch butterflies ...

is very interesting and also the concept of connecting a family's lives to these changes. However, very much in contrast to the colourful butterflies the family's members as individuals are painted in pastel colours. I really couldn't relate to their feelings, they remained strangers to me throughout the story. The main character's (Dellarobia) housewifely tedium was sometimes just too much to bear ... described on page after page after page. Very much in contrast to this the astonishing end of the book seems to have come about like some miracle. Suddenly it was there, without development, almost without explanation. As I said before I do like Barbara Kingsolver's books and have read most of them, so I dutifully trudged through this one as well. Ich brauchte ca. 50 Seiten um in das Buch hineinzukommen, aber das 'Durchhaltevermögen' hat sich gelohnt. Auf der Makroebene geht es um den Klimawandel, aber das ist nur ein Thema des Buches, auf der Mikroebene tummeln sich verschiedenste Themen: etwa Liebe, Freundschaft, Familie und Generationen, (aufgegebene/verlorene) Träume, die USA als Klassengesellschaft (der sogenannte 'White Trash' und das aufgeklärte Bürgertum), Religion, v.a. amerikanische 'Super Churches' bzw.
