I found Mnevermind 1: The Persistence of Memory intriguing and had been looking forward to the next instalment for a while. Mnevermind 2: Forget Me Not is told from Elijah's

point of view. To me, it was a fascinating read since, like Elijah, I'm a high-functioning adult with Aspergers. Jordan Castillo Price did a wonderful job writing Elijah, especially considering she doesn't have Aspergers herself. There were so many small details where I identified with Elijah: not liking to write on your hand, or one-ply toilet paper, or saying one vague sentence to a co-worker and hitting your limit for small talk for the day. It also made me sad, because of the trouble Elijah has connecting with other people, which I also struggle with. Trying to fit in with normal people, even when their conventions don't make sense, is difficult. So perhaps to some 'neurotypical' readers Elijah will be off-putting in his ways, which happens in real life all the time. But I hope that 'normal' people will read this book and maybe get a better idea how it feels to be on the spectrum, how complicated things sometimes are for us that are simple to them. And that even if it can be frustrating at times we are still loveable people worth getting to know. Anyway, it's a wonderful book and I can't wait to the next one!
