Die Männer flchten sich in Fantasiewelten, um Midlife-Crisis und Familiengedignis ertragen zu können. So bildet sich Mark ein, dass seine geschiedene Nachbarin Karen in ihn verliebt sei, wodurch er seine verkorkste Ehe ausblenden kann. Der Toy-Boy von Marks Frau Deb lebt in sexuellen Fantasien, aber auch in Fantasien von heiler Familie. Einer von Marks verheirateten Kumpels hat eine Affäre mit einem Mann und träumt von einer gemeinsamen Zukunft mit ihm. Die Frauen hingegen nehmen ihr Leben in die Hand: Karen macht Männerbekanntschaften durch Online Dating, und Deb erfindet sich als Cougar für einen Teenager neu. Doch die Heimlichkeiten und Fantasiewelten detonieren, als Deb nach einem Streit mit Karen und Mark nicht mehr nach Hause zurückkehrt....Die Handlung hat mich berzeugt, der Blick hinter die Fassade ist gelungen, auch wenn wirklich jedes Klischee bedient wird. Was mich weniger berzeugt hat, waren die Figuren, die mir manchmal als zu klischeehaft erschienen, und die Fantasien, die ich ebenfalls als klischeehaft empfand; manche der inneren Monologe fand ich ehrlich gesagt beinahe dummlich.
